Abstract: The J. Earl Way photographs, 1930-1953 contain 281 photographic prints of dirt track racing in the Northeast United States, especially in Central Pennsylvania. Notable drivers include George Herman, Mark Light, Ed Terry, and Ray Howard. Well known venues are: Central Speedway in Bird-In-Hand, PA as well as Williams Grove Speedway in Mechanicsburg, PA. Also included are other races located in Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New Hampshire. Other significant photographs include images of cars before fatal accidents, and the only photo of Joie Chitwood and Ted Horn together with J. Earl Way. The J. Earl Way photographs are not available on the <u>Revs Digitial Library</u> at this time.

Language: Materials are in English

Biography: J. "James" Earl Way was a barber in Central Pennsylvania, and in 1932 he became the coach of a local semi-professional football team. Way became involved in motorsports when the team added the attraction of holding jalopy racing during halftime on the track around the football field. When car racing became prevalent in the area, he helped organize, and served as secretary, for the Central Pennsy Racing Association. Way was involved with Pennsylvania racing from the 1930s through the 1950s, handling publicity for promoters like Ralph Hankinson at Reading and Langhorne, event promotions at Williams Grove, and midget racing at Hershey. Way also wrote about the races for local newspapers and the *National Auto Racing News*. Way's accomplishments for Pennsylvania auto racing were achieved while continuing to operate his barbershop from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., five days a week.
